The 12 Disciples of Jesus

Objective:

To explore the lives, backgrounds, strengths, and weaknesses of each of the 12 disciples, helping students understand their significance in the New Testament.

The 12 Disciples Overview

- 1. Peter (Simon)
 - **Origin:** Bethsaida, later Capernaum (John 1:44; Matthew 4:18)
 - **Strengths:** Leadership, boldness, faith (Matthew 16:16)
 - Weaknesses: Impulsiveness, denial of Jesus (Matthew 26:69-75)
 - **Life After Christ:** Became a leader in the early church; crucified upside down (traditionally).
- 2. James (son of Zebedee)
 - **Origin:** Son of Zebedee and Salome, from Galilee (Matthew 4:21)
 - **Strengths:** Zealous, a strong witness for Christ (Acts 12:2)
 - **Weaknesses:** Ambitious (Luke 9:54)
 - Life After Christ: Martyred by Herod Agrippa (Acts 12:1-2).
- 3. John
 - **Origin:** Brother of James, also from Galilee (Matthew 4:21)
 - **Strengths:** Deep love for Christ, called the "beloved disciple" (John 13:23)
 - Weaknesses: Sons of Thunder temperament (Mark 3:17)
 - Life After Christ: Exiled to Patmos, authored the Gospel of John and Revelation.

4. Andrew

- **Origin:** Brother of Peter, also from Bethsaida (John 1:40)
- **Strengths:** Faithful, brought others to Christ (John 1:41)
- Weaknesses: Less prominent, overshadowed by Peter (John 6:8)
- Life After Christ: Preached in various regions, traditionally crucified on an X-shaped cross.

5. Philip

- **Origin:** From Bethsaida (John 1:44)
- **Strengths:** Curious, direct (John 14:8)
- Weaknesses: Doubtful, hesitant (John 6:7)
- **Life After Christ:** Preached in Greece, Syria, and Phrygia; traditionally martyred.
- 6. Bartholomew (Nathanael)

- **Origin:** Likely from Cana in Galilee (John 21:2)
- Strengths: Honest, straightforward (John 1:47)
- Weaknesses: Initially skeptical (John 1:46)
- Life After Christ: Preached in various regions; traditionally martyred.
- 7. Matthew (Levi)
 - **Origin:** Tax collector from Capernaum (Matthew 9:9)
 - **Strengths:** Background in record-keeping, detailed (Gospel of Matthew)
 - Weaknesses: Viewed negatively due to his profession (Matthew 9:10-11)
 - Life After Christ: Evangelized in various regions; traditionally martyred.
- 8. Thomas (Didymus)
 - **Origin:** From the region of Judea (John 11:16)
 - **Strengths:** Loyal, courageous (John 11:16)
 - Weaknesses: Doubtful (John 20:24-25)
 - Life After Christ: Preached in India; traditionally martyred.
- 9. James (son of Alphaeus)
 - Origin: Often called James the Less; not much is detailed about him (Matthew 10:3)
 - **Strengths:** Faithful, loyal (though not much is mentioned in scripture)
 - Weaknesses: Little known; overshadowed by others
 - Life After Christ: Tradition holds he was martyred.
- 10. Thaddeus (Judas, son of James)
 - **Origin:** Son of James, possibly from Galilee (Luke 6:16)
 - **Strengths:** Faithful, asked important questions (John 14:22)
 - **Weaknesses:** Less prominent in the Gospels
 - Life After Christ: Preached in various regions; traditionally martyred.
- 11. Simon the Zealot
 - **Origin:** From Galilee (Luke 6:15)
 - **Strengths:** Passionate, zealous for God (Acts 1:13)
 - **Weaknesses:** His zeal could lead to aggression (Zealots were known for their rebellion)
 - Life After Christ: Preached in various regions; traditionally martyred.
- 12. Judas Iscariot
 - **Origin:** From Judea (John 12:4)
 - **Strengths:** Administrative skills (handled the money bag) (John 12:6)
 - **Weaknesses:** Greed, betrayal of Jesus (Matthew 26:14-16)
 - Life After Christ: Betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver; died by suicide (Matthew 27:3-5).
